

Caring for your Cat





Cats are now the most popular domestic pet in the UK and the bond between a cat and its owner can be very strong, providing huge rewards. Living up to 14 years old or more, cats make fantastic companions.

Caring for your cat's needs includes providing a good diet and regular exercise, along with lots of opportunity to play and express natural behaviours. A healthy cat will have bright eyes, clean ears, eyes and nose and be interested in what is going on around it.

Routine Healthcare

The key to recognising illness in your pet is knowing what your pet is like when it is well. An observant owner will often be able to detect subtle changes in their pet's behaviour or appetite that indicates illness well before anyone else can.

Regular visits to the vet for routine health checks and preventative health care, including vaccinations, worming treatments, flea control and dental care, allows your vet to get a familiar picture of your cat when well. It also allows the presence of any clinical disease to be detected and diagnosed earlier.

Routine Healthcare

Fleas cause discomfort and irritation and flea bites can lead to intense itching and self-inflicted trauma. Fleas also carry the larval stages of a tapeworm and cats can become infected with tapeworm when grooming. It is virtually impossible to prevent an outdoor cat coming into contact with fleas, so regular treatments are required to control the fleas and prevent a build-up within the home. Cats can also become infected with roundworm.

We have found that many non-prescription preparations do not work well enough to achieve effective parasite control and advise you to choose a veterinary licensed product / combination of products as best practice. We recommend worming adult cats every 3-6 months and monthly application of Stronghold for fleas. We offer a special discount on Stronghold - 12 months for the price of 9 months.

Neutering

We recommend neutering cats. Kittens can be neutered from a young age, but this is usually done between the ages of five and six months. For the males castration reduces straying, spraying and fighting and for the females both unwanted pregnancies and behaviour associated with a season ("calling") are eliminated. Until your kitten has been neutered, we recommend keeping them indoors.

Vaccinations

Cats, just like children, are at risk from many infectious diseases. We are strong believers that vaccinations can offer the essential protection against these deadly diseases.

To keep your cat fit and healthy make sure they complete both their initial course of vaccinations as a kitten and then receive booster jabs at yearly intervals thereafter. We vaccinate cats against cat 'flu' (feline herpes virus, feline calicivirus), feline infectious enteritis and feline leukaemia virus.

Rabies vaccinations will be required if you intend to travel to Europe with your cat.







Microchipping

Cats are very independent and often go wandering over large distances. Collars and tags, however useful, may become lost or worse still, inflict injury on your cat. It is wise to get your cat microchipped. This is a safe and permanent method of identification which increases the chance of a lost cat being safely reunited with its owner. Don't forget to update your details if you move house or change phone numbers.



Insurance

We strongly advise taking out insurance against illness and accidents for your cat. We recommend a lifetime policy to provide cover for both long-term and ongoing conditions. Our practice is accredited to Petplan, and as such we are able to advise you on their different insurance policies.

Dental Health

Dental disease is a particularly common problem in cats. As owners rarely get an opportunity to look in their cat's mouths problems may go undetected for some months or years.
